The March 19, 2019 meeting of Green Country Triumphs was held at Baxter's Interurban. Rob Thompson called the meeting to order at 7pm.



The February minutes were accepted as printed in the newsletter, after a motion by John Phillips seconded by Glenn Larson.

The treasurer's report, again delivered by John Philips, showed no changes from the prior month. The Expenses for the St. Patrick's Day party had not yet been recorded.

Car show opportunities were reviewed by Art Graves. Art highlighted the soon to come VTR Southwest Regionals on April 24-27 west of Dennison, Texas. Also mentioned were the Oklahoma City all British Breakfast Club trip set for April seventh, and the GOBMC show in Carthage Missouri. As always complete details are in the club newsletter.

Rob mentioned that his car has oil pressure issues which he believes are caused by a bad spring in the oil pressure regulator. He is losing substantial quantities of oil from somewhere. Tom Chronister reported that he has fitted a new slave cylinder in the TR4.

Kay Robinson discussed recent and near future activities. The St. Patrick's Day party was good and was appreciated. The activity she had planned for April needed to be pushed back to May on a date to be determined (possibly May 4th).

For old business Rolf Blom and Art Graves mentioned that COVTR wanted us to take care of the Funkhana, and car wash activities for the VTR regionals in 2020. The club agreed to these commitments.

For new business John mentioned that he was starting to collect next year's club dues of \$20/family. Several autographed \$20 bills were forthcoming.

The Stag sold on 5 March for \$17,350.

## **Morgan Sold**

From St. Louis Newsletter

It's been a long time since Morgan put Triumph engines in their cars (hey Mike, when *did* the supply of TR-built four-bangers end? In 1968 with the demise of the TR4 in favor of the TR5/TR250?). Whoever has supplied the motive power over the past five decades, the company's continued to turn out a small number of hand-crafted classic British sports cars. And now, with the purchase of a majority stake in Morgan by a company in Italy, the manufacturer might be on the verge of expanding operations a bit.

Kurt Ernst, in a *Hemmings* article on 8 March ("Italian firm buys controlling stake in Britain's Morgan Motor Company"), put the word out concerning control of the 110-year-old manufacturer on 5 March:

For the past 110 years, boutique British sports car manufacturer Morgan has built cars by hand, embracing the traditional over the efficient. The company has been predominantly owned by the Morgan family as well, but on March 5 a majority stake purchase by Italian private equity group InvestIndustrial was announced, bringing change — and capital — to the Malvern Link factory.





Ensure that the plug leads are attached to the sparking plugs as shown. Firing order is 1, 5, 3, 6, 2, 4, taken in anti-clockwise order, as viewed from the top of the rotor arm.

To prevent window damage when top is down fold TR6 top as shown.



3. Fold side windows on top without folding side windows, tuck top down behind seats, add cover.

#### LESSONS LEARNED

- When using an electronic ignition system byp the ballast resistor is highly recommended. T resistor is for protection of ignition points (whi no longer part of the system) and lowers voltag the plugs.
  - <u>Coolant hoses get loose over time.</u> Be sure to tighten them periodically.
  - The rear hubs on IRS cars are known to shear causing the wheel to separate from car while moving. Check by moving the raised wheel in the caster/camber attitude to check for play. There should be none.
  - Thrust bearing end float should be .011" max. Push the crank shaft (fan) rearward as far as it will go. The crank should move forward when the clutch is depressed. It should move between .004" (0.1016 mm) and .011" (0.2794 mm).

# **Greasy Hands Garage North Update**by John Phillips

3/15/2019 – This week I was watching another old James Bond film, Thunderball, and lo and behold a bad guy drives up in this. You just never know where they will pop up.



I have thought of another small project for Tinkerbell. It could do with a little more sound proofing around the differential and in the doors. Now I just need a little motivation to actually do something.

3/18/2019 – Yesterday Donna and Rob stopped by for a few minutes to drop off the new wheel alignment kit discussed in last month's newsletter. As of yet the package is unopened but it will be opened and the kit assembled to make sure it is all there and the electronics work. So, who wants to be the Guinea pig and be the first to

have their alignment checked using the new tools? Anybody? Anybody? Chicken!

3/26/2019 – Anyone that has visited the shop has probably noticed the Hustler Fast Trak mower stored there when not in use. Since there is nothing Triumph related to discuss, here is an issue that does frequently occur on our cars but in this case happened to my mower.

About a month ago the steering needed adjustment so I took it to a mower shop in Claremore and they fixed it up so it would be ready to go when needed. When I picked it up, they had trouble starting it so a pair of jumper cables was used to boost the power from the battery.

I trailered it home and unloaded it and it started fine. I drove it around to check out the steering which works well then it was parked for about a month until Spring arrived.

When the little purple flowers sprung up, I tried to start the mower and nothing happened. Since the battery had apparently not had enough power to start the mower previously it was assumed that it was time for a new one.

The old battery was removed and taken to O'Reilly's for an exchange plus \$40. When the new battery was in place, I was disappointed when it did not start. The starter was removed and taken in for testing and it checked ok.

A review of the wiring diagram told me that circuit components included, as on our cars, the starter/solenoid, the ignition switch and a relay.

The terminals on the starter were cleaned and the starter reinstalled on the engine. Then the ignition switch and relay were removed and those terminals cleaned and silicone grease applied.

I plugged everything back in prior to final assembly and tested the circuit. The engine turned over so the relay and switch were reinstalled. With everything back together the engine started and ran normally.

The moral of the story is, check for dirty terminals when you have an electrical problem on your car. Many times, it is the ground wire that needs cleaning. Sometimes it is another connection in the circuit. If you find it and clean it, it will most likely work fine.

It might also be a good idea to check the voltage on your battery before assuming it is bad.

3/27/2019 – Today is sunny and 67 degrees so I also made it the first top down drive of the Spring. The Proud Pumkin needed some time on the road and so did I.

Of course, some of the surrounding roads are well travelled and finding something out of the ordinary is kind of difficult. The route chosen was West to Memorial then North to Vera. At 390 Road I headed East and drove a nice smooth curvy road most of the way to Oologah. The last part of the road was straight as a tight string.

The drive was good because it was a road that I have not been on in years and I recognized none of it. There were a couple of abrupt stops not visible until late in the decision-making process.

At HWY 169 I headed South to Coo-Wee-Scoo-Wee Parkway and a left took me to Oologah Dam and on towards Claremore via Hwy 88. After a stop at Casey's for gas I headed on home. Great drive but now guess what time it is, ah come on, you can hear me. Guess what time it is, it's nap time.

**3/30/2019** – Charlie made it out today to work on a list of projects for Paula's TR6. The first thing up was to drain the oil and remove the filter. While the oil was draining, the transmission was checked and found to need a good bit of lubricant.

I followed the advice of John Esposito at Quantum Mechanics and used 40 WT nondetergent oil or mineral oil as the brits call it.

The dif actually had too much oil in it so some was drained out. With that done the wheel bearings were checked for play and the right front was tightened a little.

Next the new valve cover was installed along with the silicone gasket. Some gasket sealant was used on the valve cover and gasket to get the two components adhered together.



With the gasket adhered, the cover was put in place and the new hold down nuts put in place. This thing looks great and seats well with the new silicone gasket.

A new coil was installed and new plug wires put in place. New stuff in an ignition system is always a good thing, I think.

We then moved to the back of the car and removed the tail light assemblies. They were completely disassembled and cleaned to get the



One old turn signal lens was cracked and had been a deduction at a past car show so it was replaced.

New gaskets were installed inside and out so naturally we assume there will be no leaks. Naturally.



I took the lenses into the utility room and thoroughly cleaned them prior to reassembly with a soft brush, warm water and Dawn. I can say that the difference is very impressive. They look terrific.



We had some difficulty with the brake light switch which needed adjustment rearwards to allow the button to move enough to actuate the switch and turn the lights on.

As is typical, one bulb socket needed to be replaced so one was taken from the shop stores to fill the need. One of the side marker bulbs required replacement and all of the connections were cleaned to make everything work reliably.

Unfortunately, we did not get the back-up lights to work today and that will require another session.

The only other thing on Charlie's list was to change out the knobs on the dash. I showed him



the method I use to remove and replace the knobs

and turned him loose on that task while I replaced the cap over the front bearing adjustment nut that I forgot to put back on earlier.

We were in the shop from 9 to 2 today and it was a good day. We completed several things but were disappointed that the backlights remain a project for another day. We will win in the end.

**4/3/2019** – Glenn was on his way out today when I decided to disassemble the pumping

mechanism on the new transmission jack to see if there were any obvious problems.

The pumping mechanism was unpinned and component below removed. Beneath that was a port sealed by a steel ball that let oil out but not back in. when I touched the steel ball with a pick, something stuck to the pick.

The debris appeared to be a sliver of metal or a shaving that was quite thin and about ¼ inch in length. The debris had been holding the ball seal open preventing the jack from working. With the debris removed and the parts



reassembled the jack works fine. YIPPEE- KY-YAY.

Just as I finished the jack Glenn arrived and we started on his car. Tasks completed were an oil / filter change, transmission top off and a re-torque of the head fasteners. Specs call for 105 ft. lbs. but a couple of the studs felt like they were stretching so we quit before breaking something. All of the others were not at specified torque values.

This was done due to a small coolant leak on the left rear corner of the head. After retorquing there appeared to be no more leakage. The mechanical fan had caught the power wire for the electric fan and pulled the wire from the module connection to the relay so that had to be repaired. While trying to run the engine until the electric fan would come on, the mechanical fan was efficient enough to keep the engine cool so we were not able to test the working order of the electric fan.

At some point Glenn will know whether more work is needed or not. Another good day working in the shop. While on a lunch run, we picked up some oil and I bought gas. At the station I ran into Tony Mullenger and we had a nice short visit.

It occurred to me to check the timing with a progressive timing light to see what the timing should be set at to get Glenn's car to start. The numbers say that from the factory timing mark the timing should be set at 55 degrees advance. From the accepted timing location, 3/8 inch from the timing hole, it measured 35 degrees advance. No wonder I could not find a sweet spot to time the car. WOW!

Glenn called when he got home. The cooling fan is not working, the engine is overheating and pinging. I plan to visit tomorrow to retard the timing some and see if that helps.

4/5/2019 – I made it over to Glenn's garage today to try and fix his issues with pinging and overheating. Sure sounded like a timing issue to me so I set the timing on the mark 3/8 inches from the hole in the pulley and tightened it down. The car started so we drove it to Bixby for lunch and back.

No pinging and no overheating. The fuel gauge quit working but that turned out to be a fuse that had slipped out of place. The electric cooling fan does not work. We traced the system and bypassed the relay to see if the fan would start up. It did not.

The only thing I can figure is the fan motor or wiring has failed. Glenn is going to have an auto electrics guy check it out. At least we actually fixed something by retiming the engine.



If I can just fix the fuel leak!! A couple of instruments, a splash of paint and we are done!!! 1964 TR4. Anne and Derek Maeer

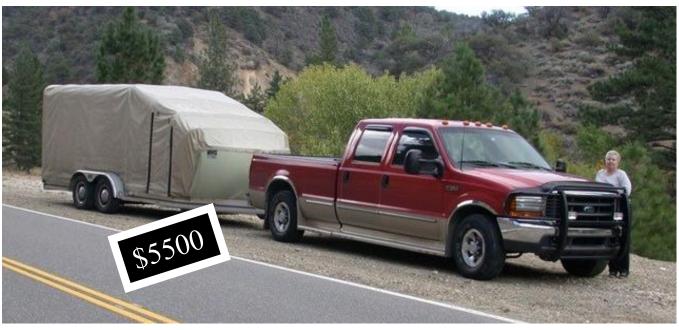
