From the St. Louis Newsletter

In a column in the February 2021 edition of Thoroughbred & Classic Car, columnist Quentin Willson has raised the alarm over a new tax on the verge of approval and implementation in the United Kingdom.

Apparently, the British treasury is in desperate need of additional revenue and they've cast an eye on any profit made by special interest vehicle owners when they sell a car. Willson writes.

But let's be clear, the days of making large dollops of profit on selling old cars have long gone. Most of us would get rather depressed if we really truly and honestly added up the cost of restoring, maintaining and preening our classics...but – and here's my anxiety – there are those mandarins and special advisers in that grey building on Horse Guards Road (Her Majesty's Treasury) who believe that classic car owners have benefitted from bundles of tax-free cash from the sale of their Bentleys and Lagondas for years and that they live in stately homes and always dress entirely in tweed. I exaggerate of course, but not by much. There is a dangerous perception that we are a

group who enjoy an unfair tax concession. Over the last few weeks, I've seen us described in the financial press as "investor hobbyists" or "amateur vintage car investors." If only...

Willson is quite blunt on what could happen if this tax goes through in the UK: it'll kill the collector car industry:

The unintended consequences of any imposition of CGT on old car sales would be to wipe out our industry, destroy many thousands of jobs, raise very little in actual tax revenue and make voters of a certain age very, very cross indeed...we've held our hobby together with the glue of enthusiasm and knowledge but also because it was possible to partly fund a restoration thanks to some of our cars' appreciation in value being free of tax. Impose CGT on the sales of classic cars and you'll destroy this industry in a heartbeat. I wave an apocalyptic finger.

Could such a tax happen here? These days I think any thing's possible, so we'll continue to monitor similar proposals, particularly if it looks like this type of capital gains tax is going to jump the Atlantic.





Greasy Hands Garage North Update by John Phillips

2/18/2021 – You are reading this in mid-April but I am writing it in mid February. The snow is still here. The Subaru is parked near the road so we can travel to town if needed.

Al and others remember how difficult my driveway can be when slick. The only sliding adventure we have had was early into the storm when, I think, Jan and I returned from her vaccination. We hit the top of the driveway and started sliding toward the shop door. We were able to get stopped well short of a collision but we got slightly panicky at first. Jan thought I was just driving too fast but I actually had no control over the speed of

decent.

outside for several days but with warmer weather finally forecast, perhaps we can park inside before long.



The picture above is from February 1, 2011, ten years ago. In that storm there was a lot more wind and drifting as you can see from the waist deep snow around the Durango.

Our former neighbors came over and shoveled the snow so we could get out for food, etc. They now live in the state of Washington and declined an invitation to come back and shovel some more snow. Come on sunshine.

2/23/2021 – It is now noon and the temperature is 61° on its way to 70 something. Great winter day for driving a Triumph.

Both cars are now running after the 8 needed a battery and new spark plugs and the work and parts to renew the clutch again on the 6 in an attempt to eliminate oil leaks has been completed.

(Follow up) There is still a leak that appears to be in the area of the filter cover of the overdrive unit. I have the parts so the work will be forthcoming.

Both jobs were completed while the winter storm was in progress but today the only snow left is small patches in shady areas.

Since most of my winter effort was expended on the 6 and I was very interested to know if any leaks would appear after it had been driven, I drove it into Owasso this morning to see what kind of results had been achieved.

The first thing I noticed was that the idle speed now rested at 950 RPM, which is perfect. I am very pleased since adjustments have been performed several times in hopes of getting this result.

The performance of the car was as I remember it. It ran fine before so running the same is OK with me. I made three different stops and there was no stalling, no running on, easy starting, what else can you ask for?

Full operating temperature was reached at stop lights so no temperature related issues are expected. Bought more milk so time to head home.

The Pumkin was pulled into the shop short of the lift equipment so that if any leaks still persist that I can see it on the floor and figure out where it is coming from. Time for something else.

After a couple of maintenance issues on home equipment it was time for a drive in the 8. I want to see how the new upgraded spark plugs work out.

Well, that did not go as well as I had hoped. The car runs great going down the road. Come to a stop sign and the car does not want to idle. Parked it back in the shop.

Work on it later. Time to get ready for the club meeting.

2/24/2021 – There are a couple of things that I need to work on for the Pumkin but the issue with Tinkerbell was bugging me. I have been thinking about why the car won't idle but run great out on the highway. Is it ignition or fuel?

I decided to try fuel first. The first guess was that there was some gumming up of the carburetor resulting from the recent period of inactivity.

Back in the day when a car would get sluggish due to too much idling or lugging around slowly driving, we would take a car out for what we called a Turnpike Tune-up. Find a road and drive the car at speed for a significant number of miles. I thought this was worth a try.

Today I did that. Google says the distance was 93 miles. The route was up 169 to Nowata, 60 to Bartlesville, (waived at Dale Smith but did not stop), 175 to 20 to Collinsville for fresh fuel, 169 to 20, then home.

Nowata was kind of depressing. It looks like a town trying to die. I have not been in that area since the last trip to the Kansas City All British Day several years ago.

When I stopped for fuel the car seemed to idle just fine. I had stopped in Oologah and Watova to make an adjustment to the idle screw and again in Nowata. It seems to work as needed at this point so now I can work on the Pumkin.

2/28/2021 – The debugging process continues after the interior was reinstalled. The driver's seat would not fold forward. First time for this issue.

My first thought was that the bolts/nuts holding the seat frame to the seat tracks on the floor may be too tight to let the seat rotate forward so I loosened them to ensure that they were not binding up. That did not correct the issue.

The bolts/nuts were then removed and the seat lifted out of the car. Nothing appeared to be binding or snagging or caught anywhere so it was reinstalled. The condition was no better.

Again, the bolts/nuts were removed and the seat frame set with the inboard attach point inboard of the seat track. I have never had them installed in this manner before but the problem was gone so I left it that way.

3/1/2021 – This was a good evening. I drove Pumkin into Owasso for a couple of Ron's hamburgers. On the way home I decided to try the radio, which I had thought was not working.

It did work so I guess my reassembly after having the tranny out was more successful than I thought. I may still make sure all the speakers are working, however.

Good day!

3/7/2021 – Projects with meaningful content are not plentiful at the moment so I settle for talking about menial tasks. For instance, I drove Pumkin to a funeral yesterday. One attendee was interested in Triumphs so I raised the bonnet to show him the engine bay.

While it was up, for some reason I touched the alternator belt to check for tightness. It was loose.

This afternoon I helped Jan get the St. Patrick's Day decorations out of the attic then went to the shop to correct the belt tightness. It was tight the last time I worked on the alternator but they do stretch as time goes by.

The top bolt/nut and the bottom bolt/nut were loosened a little and the alternator swiveled up a dab. The bolts/nuts were then retightened and the job was done. Wasn't that exciting.

3/10/2021 – Yesterday I had a very enjoyable drive in the TR8 to the Tulsa fairgrounds to get the second Covid 19 vaccine shot. The process is more mature at

this stage so I got right in and had to wait a little until it was my turn to get shot.

The cycle is now complete so it was back in the 8 to get back to Owasso for some shopping for a new light bulb for the kitchen and dog food for you know who.

Back at home it was nap time. My allergies are not treating me well. Grass and trees are kicking my tail.

3/18/2021 – I guess while there is a lull in the work load now is as good a time as any to replace the seals in the lift so it will again raise all the way and not spoil the floor with hydraulic oil.

To that end, Jim has been trying to help me decide upon which seal kit to purchase. The end result is that a kit for a TP9 ram has been ordered and upon receipt will be installed in the ram on the west side of the lift. The east side seems fairly stable at this point so that side will be done when needed.

3/23/2021 – The kit that we hope fits the cylinder on the lift arrived yesterday. Today, Jim and I are going to take the cylinder out of the pedestal, removed the shaft assembly and replace the seals. I hope this is the right seal kit and it works

Noon and the cylinder is out of the upright and the shaft/pulley assy is on the table. There is a 1 1/8 bolt head holding it all together and we cannot get it to budge.

Jim left for a Dr. appointment and to pick up a ¾ inch impact wrench. Hopefully that will be enough to remove the bolt so we can get everything apart to see what the seal kit is supposed to look like.

You guessed it, the seal kit I purchased from Amazon was not the correct kit. Now the search is on for the correct kit but the old seals need to be visible for comparison of old to new. That big bolt must come out.

We did exceed my expectations in one area of the work, the mess we made was much bigger than I expected. We used air pressure to finally get the internal shaft out of

the cylinder and hydraulic oil went everywhere. My next job is to get the fluid off the TR8.

Jim returned with a ¾ inch impact wrench that removed the big bolt immediately. With the bolt out we had access to all the rubber components that seal the hydraulic fluid properly.

Tomorrow we travel to Tulsa in search of the proper seals to finish the rebuild.

3/24/2021 -

Sam called this morning. He needed a ride to the doctor for an adjustment to his prosthetic. It was rubbing blisters on his shin. The original plan was for Jim and I to go to Tulsa for getting some work done on part of his boat as well as hunt for seals for the lift cylinder.

We ended up going separately. Sam got to see the doctor for a short visit and then I dropped him off at home to continue on with my search.

The first place was all locked up and no one around. The second place had no parts that I needed. I did

recommend three other places however.

One place was close so I looked there first but they had none of the parts I needed. The next place was located NE of the 244 & 75 junction, Crown Products had all the parts needed for the lift. It is now 2:30 and I am tired so tomorrow I will start re-assembly.

3/25/2021 – I found that one of the O'rings purchased yesterday was too small so I looked at O'Reilly's and thought I found one that would work. I was wrong. Next, I went to Ace Hardware and found one that would work and installed it when back at the shop.

Jim had arrived by then so we proceeded to reassemble the various parts

and put them back in the cylinder. We got the cylinder back into the upright without too much trouble but then ignorance took over. We needed to learn more before getting the fluid changed. We decided to sleep on it.

I did some research and decided to replace all the fluid. It seems you are supposed to do that periodically. Atwoods had the ISO 32 oil so I have it

on hand to continue work tomorrow.

3/26/2021 – YouTube helped a lot. Today I removed the fluid reservoir, emptied it, cleaned it and a filter. Three and ½ gallons of the fluid purchased yesterday was placed back in the reservoir.

I called Jim to see if he could come

over long enough to put the screws and nuts back in that hold the reservoir to the bottom of the pump and he said he would do that.

When he got here, I lifted the filled reservoir while

Jim put the fasteners in and the job was done. We tested it several times and were delighted with the results, went all the way to the top and did not leak.





LESSONS LEARNED

- When using an electronic ignition system byp the ballast resistor is highly recommended. T resistor is for protection of ignition points (whi no longer part of the system) and lowers voltag the plugs.
 - *Coolant hoses get loose over time.* Be sure to tighten them periodically.
 - The rear hubs on IRS cars are known to shear causing the wheel to separate from car while moving. Check by moving the raised wheel in the caster/camber attitude to check for play. There should be none.
 - Thrust bearing end float should be .011" max. Push the crank shaft (fan) rearward as far as it will go. The crank should move forward when the clutch is depressed. It should move between .004" (0.1016 mm) and .011" (0.2794 mm).
